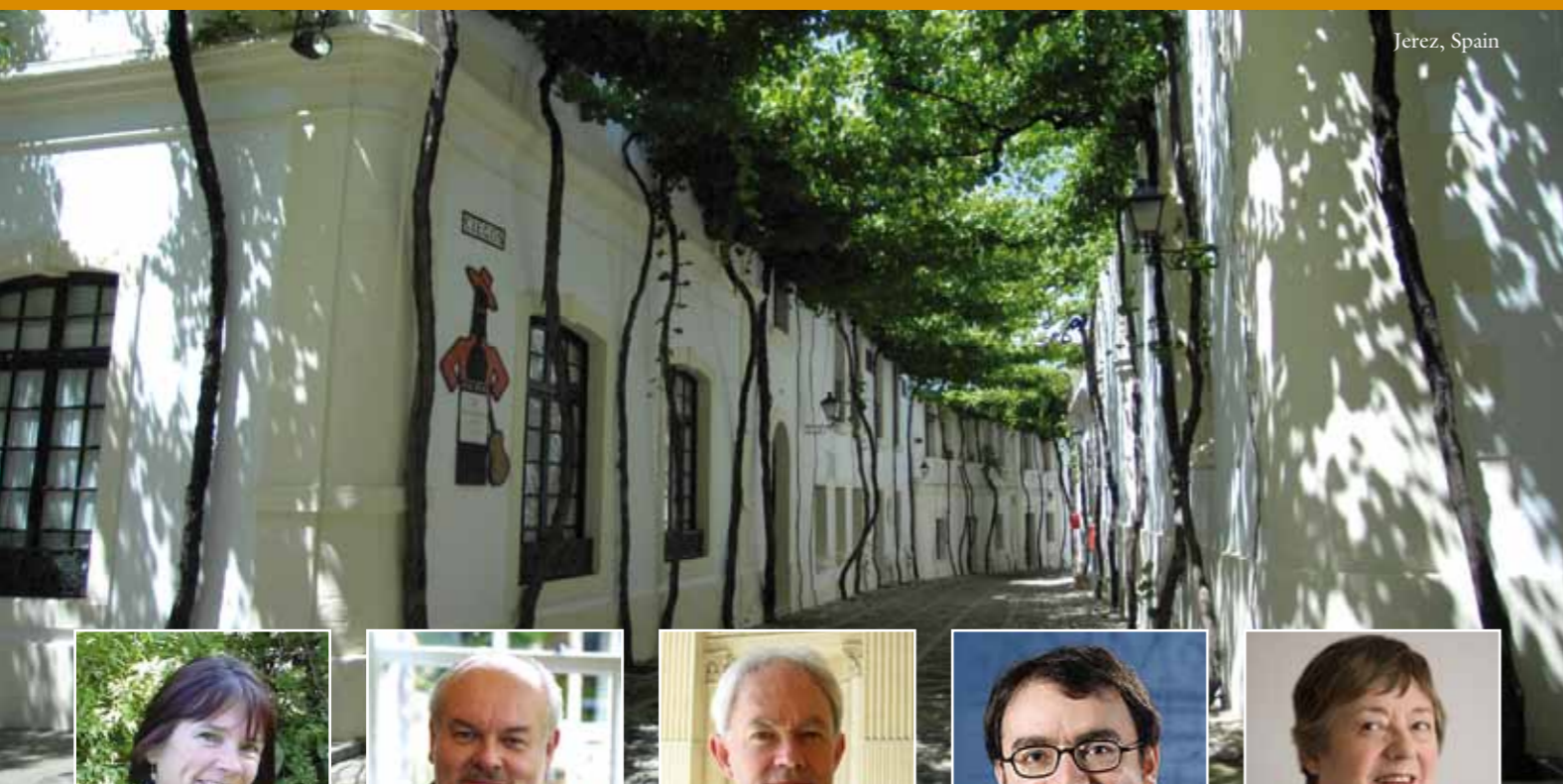


GUEST SPEAKERS FEATURED ON THIS CRUISE



Jerez, Spain



DR CATHY OAKES is a lecturer and writer who specialises in the art and visual culture of the Middle Ages and Early Renaissance; she has published on various aspects of Medieval art in relation to theology and devotional practices. Cathy has spent 30 years in arts education and is currently Director of the History of Art at Oxford University's Department of Continuing Education.

THE RT REVD & RT HON DR RICHARD CHARTRES KCVO DD is currently Bishop of London and Dean of HM Chapels Royal. Before ordination he taught Ancient History in the International School in Seville. He has also served as Gresham Professor of Divinity in the City of London and written the history of Gresham College. He has a special interest in the Roman and Medieval periods.

PROFESSOR SIMON KEAY FSA researches into the archaeology of the Roman Empire, with particular emphasis on trade, urbanism and culture change in the west Mediterranean basin. He is currently Principal Investigator on the AHRC-funded Roman towns in the Tiber Valley Project and, in his capacity as Research Professor at the British School at Rome, is also Director of the AHRC-funded Portus Project, which looks at the port of Imperial Rome in the context of the broader Roman Mediterranean.

DR PHILIP DE SOUZA FRHistS is Head of the School of Classics at University College Dublin. He specialises in ancient history, but has also published works on world and maritime history including *Piracy in the Graeco-Roman World* (1999), *Seafaring and Civilization: Maritime Perspectives on World History* (2001) and *The Ancient World at War: A Global History* (2008).

MRS MAGGIE MCNIE M.W. Initially trained as an actress and opera singer, Maggie entered the wine trade on a temporary basis working in quality control, marketing and Agency sales. Appointed as Product Knowledge Manager she took the various wine exams and finally became a Master of Wine in 1986. Since then she has worked as a wine consultant, speaker, writer and international wine judge. Her top speciality is champagne, and she is author of a book called *Champagne* published by Faber & Faber in October 1999.

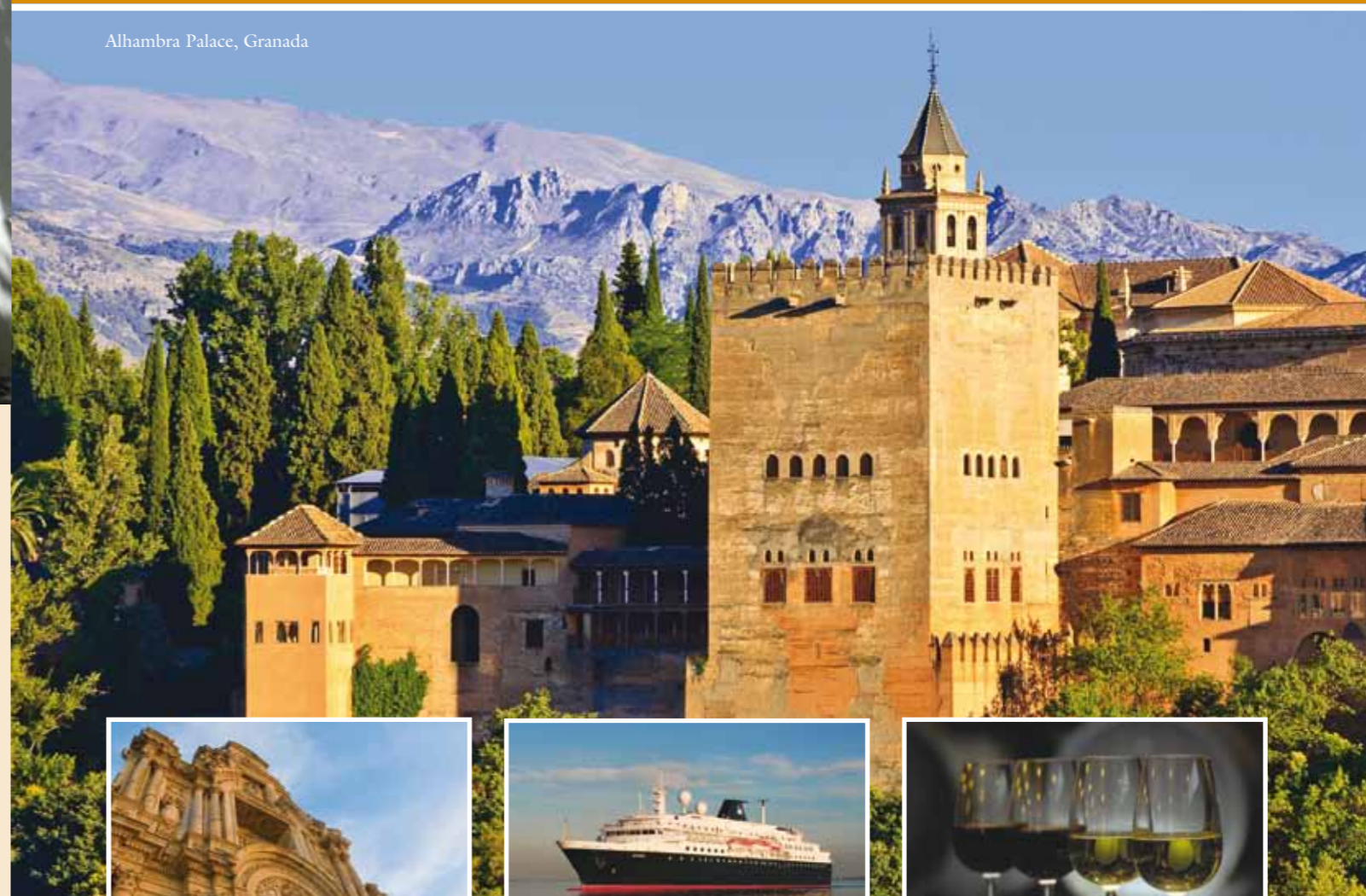

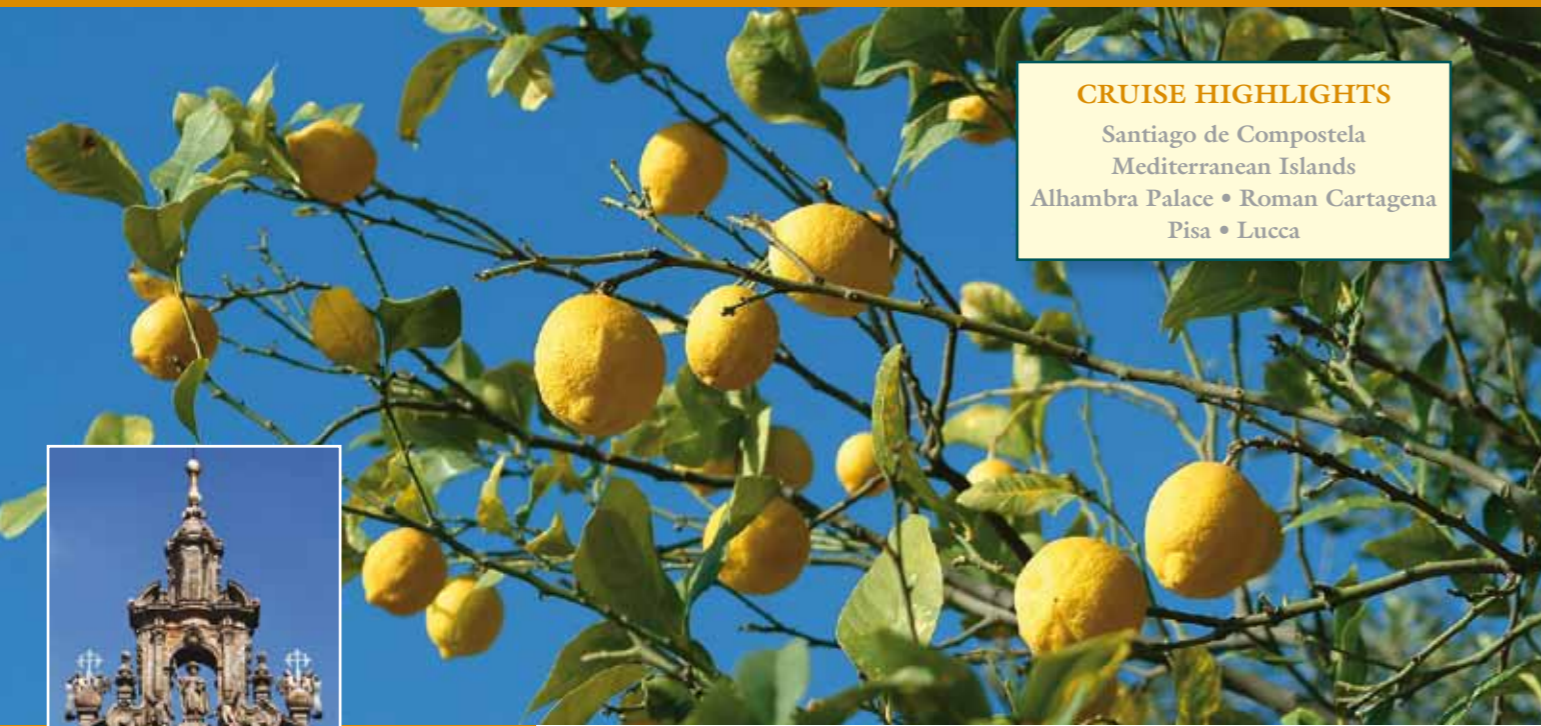

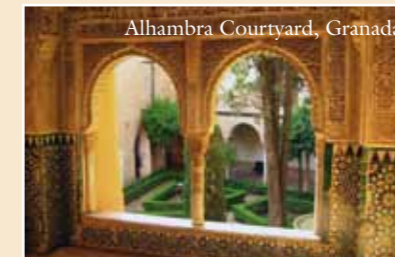
